

DISTANCE TO TOWN AROUND A 10 MINUTE DRIVE

AT A GLANCE

Ancient city walls. Higgledy-piggledy red rooftops. Cobbled streets worn by time. That's Dubrovnik, a heart-stealing city that you just know you're going to love the moment you arrive.

The Cruise Terminal is located at the Gruz district which has a few restaurants outside of the port. Old town Dubrovnik is within the city walls and can be accessed via the Pile Gate. If you're looking to get your steps in, you can walk from the port to the Old Town, which will take approximately 45 minutes.

Alternatively, taxi services can be found within the port gates. You can expect to pay around €15 per taxi to the entrance of Pile Gate. There's also local buses travelling from the port gate to Pile Gate. The bus numbers are 1A, 1B, 1C and 3. Tickets cost approximately €2 per person one way and can be purchased at the bus station just outside of the port exit by the security gates.

OUT AND ABOUT

Walk the City Wall: They were once used for safety and protection against invaders but are now filled with history & beauty. The walls are 1940 meters long with 6 fortresses. Prices start from €35 Adult €15 Child.

The Elaphite islands: A must-see made up of six islands in the archipelago, here you can discover the legends that have stacked up over the years and get away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life.

Fortress Lovrijenac: Often called "Dubrovnik's Gibraltar", is a fortress built upon a 37 meter high rock overlooking the sea, it's one of the most impressive locations in Dubrovnik. Entrance fee is approx. €7.

BEST BEACHES

If you're looking to take a nice dip in the beautiful seas of Dubrovnik then head over to Copacabana Beach on the Lapad peninsula. This is one of the most popular beaches and is a 10 minute drive away. Another popular destination is the pebble Banje Beach which is also a 10 minute drive away.

SHOPPING

You definitely won't struggle to shop in Dubrovnik, as shops line every winding street within the city walls. Head along the street of Placa Stradun, where you'll find small boutiques and souvenir shops. There's also a market on Gundulic Square opposite the Rector's Palace. By the end of the day, you may find your purses a little lighter and your suitcases a little heavier.

DO IT LIKE THE LOCALS

Embark on a thrilling adventure in Dubrovnik with a ride on the city's renowned cable car. Ascend to the summit of Mount Srd in style, where panoramic vistas of the Adriatic Sea and the charming Old Town await. Capture breathtaking moments from the observation deck, immersing yourself in the beauty of Dubrovnik's historic skyline. Whether you're a nature enthusiast or a history buff, a cable car journey promises an unforgettable experience, offering a bird's-eye view of this enchanting coastal gem.
