Distance to Town Centre The town centre from the pier is approx. 800 meters therefore it's only a short walk from where the ship will be docking.

Main Highlights

Haugesund Town Hall was a gift from shipowner Knut Knutsen OAS and his wife Elisabeth. The town hall was designed by architects Gudolf Blakstad and Hermann Munthe-Kaas and was officially opened in 1931. The park was opened in 1949. The pink town hall is one of the most farmous buildings in the country and contains a wealth of artistic decorations. The building and its surrounding areas have been preserved.

KIB-media in Haugesund made this film, which takes you on spectacular helicopter flights under Risøy Bridge, over Pulpit Rock and Folgefonna Glacier. Moods from Sildajazz, quiet nature and a stormy ocean are also included.

Museum of Cultural History is centrally placed in downtown Haugesund (close to the church) you find Karmsund folkemuseum. The museum concentrates on the history of the town and region. Exhibitions show important parts of this history farming, herring-fisheries, shipping trade and the development of the town Haugesund. On display is a wealthy citizen's elegant dining room, the oldest shop in town and a classroom from 1910. An authentic 1930-office is on display in the town exhibition. Entrance fee: 50 NOK per adult 6 30 NOK for senior/students open Monday to Friday between 10.00-14.00.

Our Viking history, fjords, islands, mountains, waterfalls, glaciers, rivers and the town itself all combine to make this region an exciting cruise destination.

Fans of history and culture are well catered for in this town. A visit to the Nordvegan History Centre will provide the perfect opportunity to "experience Norway's birthplace". Visitors will learn about Norway's history and also about the sovereigns that ruled the region.

Nature lovers and beach fanatics should take the time to go and enjoy a hike in the Karmoy beaches. The available natural trail leads visitors on a hike that rewards with beautiful views of the white sandy beaches, and historical monuments located further South.
