

AT A GLANCE

We'll drop anchor in Mykonos and will tender directly to the town with only around a 5 minute walk from the tender drop-off area to reach the many cafes and restaurants. By foot, you'll be greeted by quaint, beautiful white washed buildings.

Wander around the mazing streets to discover some local stores selling all kinds of locally produced items. Make a beeline for the windmills perched above the town of Mykonos for great views.

Due to the size of the island, there are a very limited number of taxis and unfortunately taxis are not allowed in the main town of Mykonos. You will need to walk to the exit of the town just after Mano Square to catch a taxi which work on a meter, but it's always worth confirming a price beforehand.

OUT AND ABOUT

Little Venice: Little Venice is a charming waterfront district in Mykonos Town known for its colorful buildings hanging over the sea, offering stunning sunset views and waterfront dining.

Windmills of Mykonos: The Windmills of Mykonos are iconic landmarks atop a hill near Mykonos Town, symbolizing the island's history and offering panoramic views of the Aegean Sea.

Archaeological Museum of Mykonos: The Archaeological Museum of Mykonos showcases artefacts from the island's ancient civilizations, providing insight into its rich past through pottery, sculptures, and jewellery.
