

DISTANCE TO TOWN
AROUND A 45-MINUTE WALK

Depending on where you dock, it's a 45-minute to 1.5-hour walk to the city. At Terminal 6, you can catch a public bus or the Hop-On Hop-Off bus right outside. Taxis are also available. For something closer, explore the trendy Portixol neighbourhood with cafes, dining, and coastal views, just a short stroll from the terminal!

OUT AND ABOUT

Hop On Hop Off Sightseeing Bus: The Hop-On Hop-Off bus in Palma and explore up to 16 sights. Jump off to discover the best spots, then hop back on for more fun and views!

Bellver Castle: Just a 10-minute drive away, Bellver Castle offers stunning views of Palma Bay from its unique round shape. The name "Bellver" means "lovely view" in Catalan, and today, this historic castle is home to a fascinating museum. It's the perfect spot to step back in time and take in breath-taking sights!

Palma Cathedral (Catedral-Basílicade Santa María de Mallorca): Discover the stunning Palma Cathedral, a Gothic masterpiece that will leave you in awe! With its soaring spires, colourful stained glass, and breath-taking views, this iconic landmark is a must-see in the heart of Palma.

BEST BEACHES

Cala Major is just a quick 15-minute taxi ride from Palma's cruise terminal. It's a peaceful beach with clear waters and cosy cafes. If you're after something livelier, head to Playa de Palma, just a 20 minute drive where you'll find a bustling beach lined with bars and restaurants.

SHOPPING

Just a short walk from the cruise terminal, Porto Pi Shopping Centre offers shops, dining, and a cinema. For a local touch, explore Palma's city centre and Passeig del Born for boutiques, or visit the Mercat de l'Olivar near the Cathedral for fresh local treats!

DO IT LIKE THE LOCALS

Try pa amb oli – toasted bread with tomato, olive oil, cheese, ham, and olives. Pair it with fresh orange juice from Soller Valley or a local white wine. For dessert, enjoy a slice of almond cake, a Majorcan classic.
