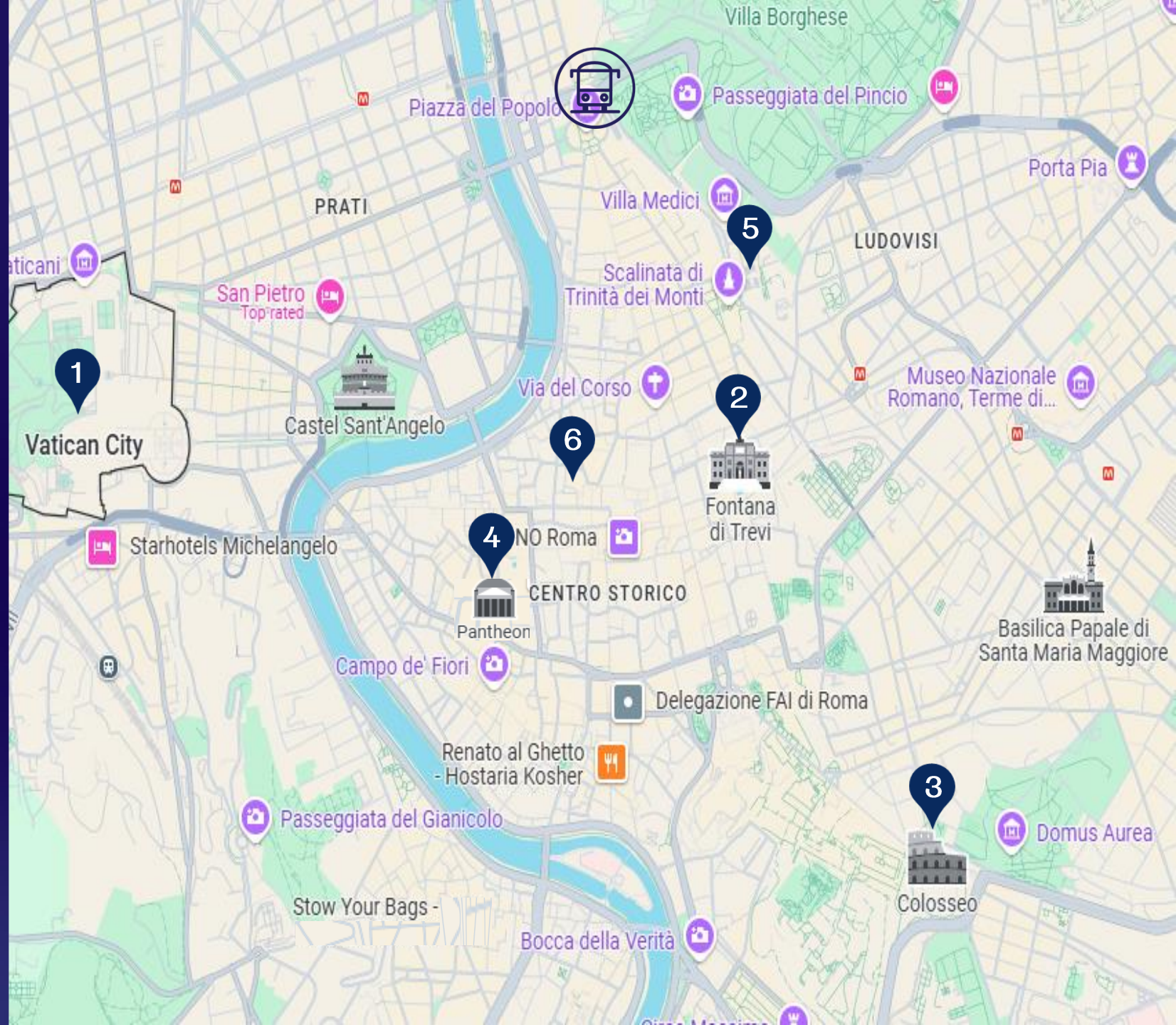

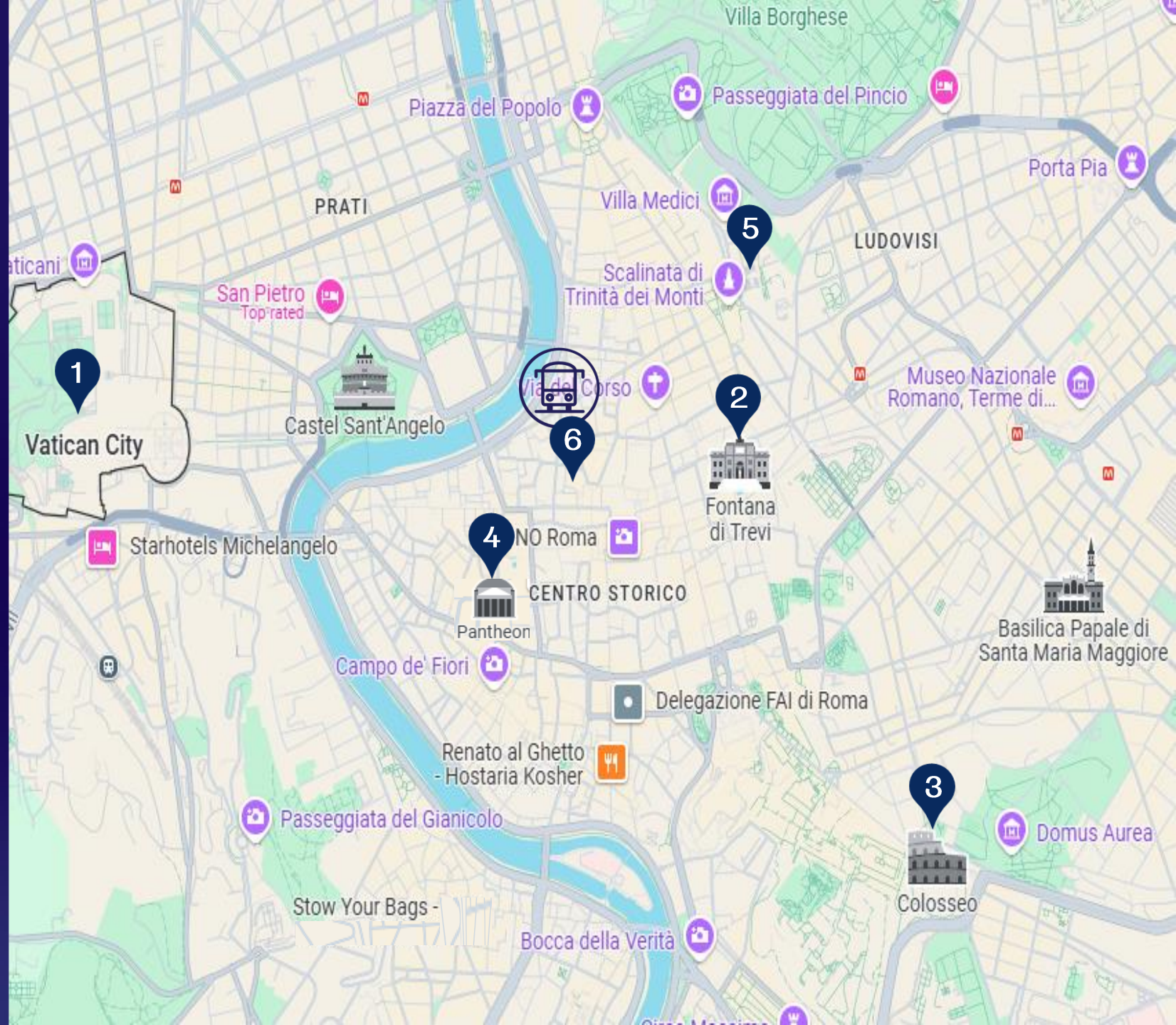

Rome Explorer

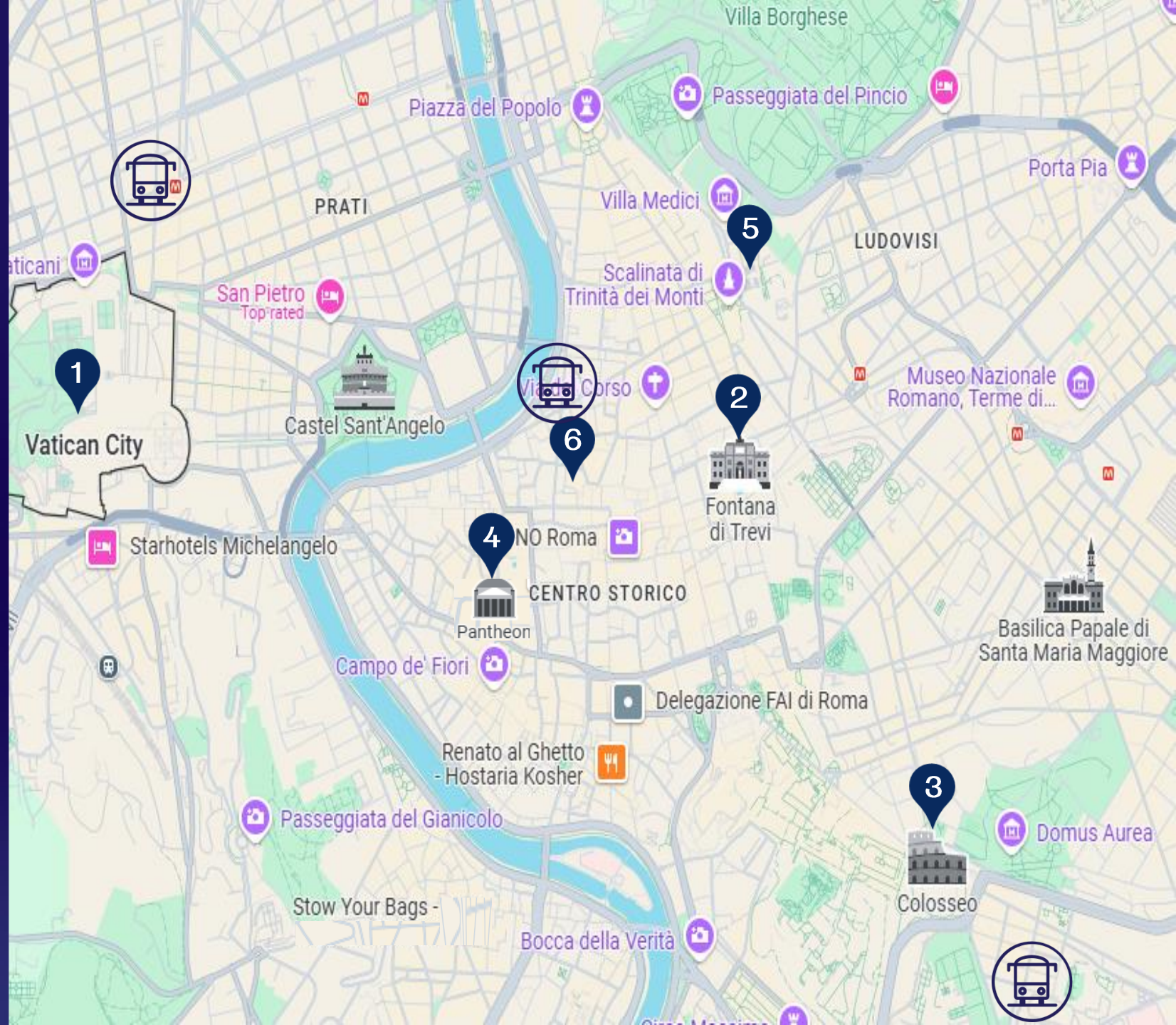

AT A GLANCE

Few cities on earth have the power to bowl you over quite like Rome. Discover a city packed with historical wonder, artistic splendour and culinary temptation at every turn. Not to mention enough designer shops to keep you browsing for a year, Rome has enough for everyone.

On arrival to the Eternal City you can relive the glory days of the gladiators at the eye-popping Colosseum, or head for the Vatican City, the heart of the Catholic Church. Stroll along charming cobblestone streets, relax in beautiful piazzas, and indulge in some of the best Italian food you'll ever taste.

OUT AND ABOUT

The Colosseum: Rome's iconic symbol of ancient power and entertainment, where gladiators once battled for glory, and crowds cheered for every epic showdown. A true Roman marvel, even after centuries of wear and tear, it still stands tall as one of Rome's most legendary sights.

The Trevi Fountain: Known for its stunning Baroque design, that says if you throw a coin into its waters, you'll be sure to return to the Eternal City. Located in the heart of Rome, it features Neptune riding a chariot pulled by seahorses, symbolizing the power of the sea

The Vatican City: Nestled in the heart of Rome, this independent state is home to the Pope. The city is packed with architectural marvels, the most famous being St. Peter's Basilica, an awe-inspiring church designed by Michelangelo, with its magnificent dome offering panoramic views of the city

The Pantheon: Originally built as a temple to all the gods, it stands as a masterpiece of Roman engineering. The highlight is its massive dome, which remains the world's largest unreinforced concrete dome to this day.

FURTHER AFIELD

The train journey from Civitavecchia to Rome typically takes around an hour. Trains depart from Civitavecchia's main station, which is located close to the port, to the primary destination in Rome—Roma Termini, the city's main railway hub.

SHOPPING

Rome is a shopper's paradise! Snag luxury finds near the Spanish Steps, uncover quirky treasures in Monti and Trastevere, or hit Via del Corso for high street style. Whether you're hunting for luxury, local delights, or hidden gems, Rome has it all!

DO IT LIKE THE LOCALS

Skip the touristy traps and grab a coffee at a local bar. Or for a true Roman feel, pop into a small trattoria for a plate of pasta and a glass of wine—no rush, just enjoy the moment. For an authentic Roman food experience, try Cacio e Pepe, a pasta with Pecorino Romano and black pepper.

JUST SO YOU KNOW

The Jubilee Year is a significant event in Rome, happening throughout this year. It draws millions of pilgrims and an increase in tourists, meaning larger crowds and a busier-than-usual atmosphere in the city. Expect potential road closures, traffic congestion, and possible changes to bus drop-off and pick-up locations.

As with all tourist destinations, pick-pockets can operate in crowded areas so please be mindful of your possessions.
