Taxis	Taxis are available from outside the terminal. Most fares are set, however if a ride is not metered, we suggest that you agree a price with the driver before starting your journey.	Main highlights	Temple of Segesta (Tempio Greco) This unfinished 5th century Doric temple has everything but a roof. The huge structure seems unaffected by time. A small theatr atop a nearby hill offers visitors stunning views of the green cushioned hills and surrounding countryside. This is about a 1 hour drive from the port. Trapani is famous for its churches. You can't miss the Cathedral and the Sanctuary of Annunziata (Madonna of Trapani). Churches are open in the morning and afternoon. The cable car is available to take you to the mountain village of Erice. You'll need to take a taxi from outside the port gates to the cable car station, which is called Funivia. This takes about 10-15 minutes or alternatively catch local bus 21 or 23. The cable car costs €9 return but will not operate when there's strong winds. The town centre is lovely to walk around and admire the beautiful baroque buildings and various churches.
Local buses	Local buses run from outside the port area. The most up to date information is available from the tourist information inside the terminal.		
Other transport options	There's a tourist train is available from outside of the port gates and offers you a tour of Trapani city. Times are scheduled and tickets cost only 10 Euros for approximately 30 minutes. The Information desk for the train is located inside the terminal building. There are also 2 red double decker buses that offer a tour of Trapani and the cost is around 12 Euros for approximately 45 minutes. They maybe a break in service for lunch.		
Distance to town centre	The town centre is just a short walk away, approximately 500 metres from the ship.		
Best way to reach the centre	The easiest way to reach the city centre is by foot, a 10 minute walk from the ship along Plaza Garabaldi.

Nearest internet	You'll find an internet café situated just along via Ammiraglio Staiti, that is the seaside promenade along Garibaldi pier. At approximately 600 metres from the ship.	Shopping	The main shopping area is situated in the town centre, which is a short walk away. In the town you'll find all main shopping needs from chic boutiques to local produce. Shops are generally open between 9am - 1pm then after siesta 4pm - 8pm. The shops are mainly boutiques and there's only one commercial centre. The main street of Trapani, Via Giovan Battista Fardella, is approximately 1km from the ship and has many shops selling clothes, shoes, jewellery, bags and perfumes. You'll also find a great selection of cafes, where you can sit outside and relax and enjoy a typical Italian coffee or ice cream PLEASE NOTE: Please be vigilant as in a areas you travel and do not take more cash or jewellery than you need!
Nearest bank	The nearest bank machine is situated on the main road opposite the terminal building and will accept most banks cards.		
Nearest pharmacy	Pharmacies are situated in the town centre. They are shown by a large green cross outside.		
Nearest beach	The nearest beaches are situated along Lungomare Dante Alighieri, which is a 20 minutes walk from the ship. Please note there are no beach facilities available from these beaches, until high season.
